Types of Bequests

There are a number of ways you can make a bequest to the Public Concern Foundation.

Specific Bequest. A specific bequest involves making a gift of a specific asset, such as a gift for a specific dollar amount, a car, real estate or other property.

Percentage Bequest. Another kind of specific bequest involves leaving a specific percentage of your overall estate to charity.

Residual Bequest. A residual bequest is made from the balance of an estate after the will or trust has distributed each of the specific bequests. A common residual bequest involves leaving a percentage of the residue of the estate to charity.

Contingent Bequest. A contingent bequest is made to charity only if the purpose of the primary bequest cannot be met. For example, you could leave specific property, such as a vacation home, to a relative, but the bequest language could provide that if the relative is not alive at the time of your death, the vacation home will go to the Public Concern Foundation.

Bequest Language

In order to make a bequest, you should speak with your attorney. Your attorney can help you include a bequest to the Public Concern Foundation in your estate plan. We have provided some basic bequest language below to assist you and your attorney.

1. Specific Bequest

If you are considering making an outright bequest to the Public Concern Foundation, we recommend the following language:

Bequest of Specific Personal Property

Bequest of Specific Real Estate

I hereby give, devise and bequeath all of the right, title and interest in and to the real estate located at ADDRESS OR DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY to the Public Concern Foundation, 105 Hudson Street, Suite 407, New York, NY, 10013 (Tax ID 51-0217084), for general use and purpose.

2. Percentage Bequest

If you are considering making a bequest of a percentage of your estate to the Public Concern

4. Contingent Bequest
